CALL TO ORDER: 8:00 PM PRESIDING: John N. Garrabrandt

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To conduct the regular business of the College District, and such other as may lawfully come before the Board of Trustees.

ATTENDING: Trustees: John Garrabrandt, John Coleman, John Hepworth, Eldon

Evans, and Robert Blastock.

Administration: Dr. James L. Taylor, Attorney Robert Alexander,

and Secretary Herb Van Slyke.

Visitors: Fred Frazier of Greater Idaho Corporation (Sierra Life

Insurance Company), Lee Tremaine and Annette Jenkins of

the press.

MINUTES APPROVED: The Minutes of the May 17, 1971 meeting of the Board, having been in the hands of the Board members well ahead of this meeting, were approved as written upon a MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Hepworth.

LAND DEVELOPMENT NORTH OF CSI CAMPUS: Fred M. Frazier, President of Sierra Life
Insurance Company and Greater Idaho Corporation appeared before the
Board to present the plans of the corporation for development of an
extensive housing project immediately north of the CSI campus on North
Washington.

He told the Board the plans call for building of student housing dorm/ apartment units, apartment complexes suitable for faculty and staff of the College, a planned community of condiminium housing, and a service center and club for all residents of the development.

There will be 1 bedroom and 3 bedroom apartment style student housing which will rent for \$85 and \$300 (for 6 students) per month respectively. The 1 bedroom are for married students. Rent will be payable in advance by the month with the first and last months payable at the beginning of the lease period.

The project will be 100% electric; the service center will include laundry, a barber and beauty shop and a small club.

Mr. Frazier indicated that his primary interest, at this point, is to have the blessing of the College.

The Board took cognizance of the intent of the developers in the construction of this proposed \$15,000,000.00 project, but agreed that it shall remain non-committal at this time.

- CHAIRMAN LEAVES, VICE-CHAIRMAN ASSUMES ROLE: Chairman Garrabrandt asked to be excused at 9:00 PM, and Vice-Chairman Evans to assume the role of presiding officer for the balance of the meeting. This was done.
- TREASURER'S REPORT, BILLS PAID, MAY PAYROLLS ACKNOWLEDGED: Upon MOTION by
 Mr. Coleman, seconded by Mr. Hepworth, and passed, the Board took the
 following action:
 - (a) Approved the May report of the Treasurer, as submitted.
 - (b) Allowed payment of bills, and transfers, as follows:
 - (1) General Fund Vouchers #1-#269 inclusive totalling \$73,190.94.
 - (2) General Fund Transfers covered by Vouchers #270-#276 inclusive \$7,015.70.
 - (c) Acknowledged May payrolls Regular \$95,525.86, Work Study \$18,312.64.
- PERSONNEL EMPLOYED: Dr. Taylor recommended the employment of the following named persons, and other conditions pertinent thereto:

For Academic Programs:

Tom Breske, Associate Professor, Music, at a salary of \$11,000.00 for 1971-72 academic year.

Dr. Calvin Butler, Associate Professor, Math, at a salary of \$10,000.00 for the 1971-72 academic year.

For Associate Degree Nursing (RN) Program:

Jane Graf at a salary of \$9,250.00 for 10 months.

Marilyn Adkison at a salary of \$9,500.00 for a 10 month program.

Peggy Stanfield at a salary of \$4,000.00 for a 10 month program. (Partial load)

For Vocational Programs:

Karl Black, Assistant Professor, Business Cluster Courses at a salary of \$11,100.00 for 12 months starting August, 1971.

Gi Gi Erdoisa, LPN Instructor at a salary of \$8,700.00 for 12 months starting June 1, 1971.

Jay Hill, Adult Piano Instructor, at a salary of \$300.00 for a 30 hour course to start June 21, 1971.

Lucille Pimentel, Instructor Nurses Aide at a salary of \$6.00 per contact hour.

Upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Coleman, the aforementioned persons were employed as recommended.

- OLD BUSINESS: Dr. Taylor reported that the construction contracts on both Phases 2 and 3 are not yet complete. The matter of the parallel-grey glass of the lower floor of the Multi-Use Building has not yet been replaced.
- NEW BUSINESS AND PRESIDENT'S REPORT: (1) Regarding Phase V which will be additional Vocational buildings on Campus. Dr. Taylor told the Board Harry Stone of the Idaho Department of Public Works has approved CTA Architects for the \$2,100,000 proposed project.

- (2) Inequities in the distribution of the liquor fund revenues are expected to be corrected in the 1972 legislative session. Dr. Taylor has correspondence on the matter.
- (3) (a) Summer sessions are invloving 760 students.
 - (b) Tennis courts are almost completed, and include border areas which allow room for other activities concurrent with tennis.
 - (c) Trying to start a growth of native grass in the berm areas.
 - (d) Grass has been seeded east of dorm, for a practice baseball field.
 - (e) Fish diagnostic clinic was a real success.
 - (f) TV station public notice being given; \$1000 deposit being requested.

ADJOURNMENT was declared at 9:55 PM.
