CALL TO ORDER: 7:55 PM

PURPOSE: To conduct the regular business of the CSI Junior College District and such other as may lawfully come before the Board of Trustees of said District.

ATTENDANCE: Trustees: John N. Garrabrandt, John C. Hepworth, and Robert Blastock.

Absent: John R. Coleman and Eldon V. Evans.

Administration: Dr. James L. Taylor, Secretary Herb Van Slyke,

and Attorney Robert Alexander.

MINUTES: The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of July 17 were approved as written upon motion by Mr. Hepworth, seconded by Mr. Blastock.

TRESURER'S REPORT: Submitted in written detail; approved by motion of Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Hepworth; carried unanimously.

BILLS PAID: The abstract of July bills was reviewed and discussed.

A motion was made by Mr. Hepworth, seconded by Mr. Blastock, and carried without dissent, that:

- 1. General Fund Vouchers #1 through #241 in the aggregate of \$73,700.52 be paid.
- 2. Fund Transfers covered by vouchers #242 through #245 to-talling \$65,830.17 be approved.
- 3. July Payrolls: Regular \$145,363.96, Work Study \$15,838.85, be acknowledged.

SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED: The Board of Trustees awarded eleven scholarships totalling \$1,825.00 from the Educational Trust Account. This was done upon Motion by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Hepworth.

SHELTERED ANNUITY RESTRICTED: Upon Motion made by Mr. Hepworth, seconded by Mr. Blastock, and carried unanimously, the Board adopted the following resolution.

RESOLUTION

Effective as of August 1, 1972, the College of Southern Idaho will not accept applications or authorizations from any insurance company not now in the list of companies furnishing tax sheltered annuities for employees of the

College <u>unless</u> the new applicant company shall have bonafide agreements for purchase of annuities from not less than five (5) permanent employees of the College; said agreements must be confirmed in writing by the subject employees.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor included the following in his report:

5/31/73 @ \$950 month.

- 1. New parking area construction for 125 cars to serve the new Vo-Tech Building, progressing satisfactorily; sub grade in and compacted.
- 2. Faculty In-Service Workshop with Dr. John Rork of Denver as consultant discussing the Omnibus Education Bill which has passed in Congress but has not yet been funded. Particularly Title III applications came under consideration, and the impact of Title X on junior college occupational education and vocational training. The ultimate objective of the Act appears to be universal public education through grade 14.
- 3. CLEP (College Level Entry Performance) program and its implications were explained.
- 4. Western States Consortium consisting of Wyoming, Utah, Montana, and Idaho has seventeen members and operates under a grant from WICHE. CSI has \$3,400 allocated to it from WICHE, which can be used largely for travel.

Areas of concern include: better ways to evaluate faculty, impact of new legislation, remedial and special education, student personnel services, etc.

5. The Association of Community College Trustees will be meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, October 5-7, 1972. In response to the question of who might be able to attend, Chairman Garrabrandt indicated he could and would like to represent CSI at this convention.

ADJOURNMENT: No further business appearing, the meeting was adjouned at 9:05 PM.
