COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING AUGUST 20, 1973

CALL TO ORDER: 8:03 PM

PRESIDING: John Hepworth

ATTENDING: Trustees: John Hepworth, Robert Blastock, Eldon Evans, John Garrabrandt and John Coleman.

Administration: Dr. James L Taylor, President; Karl L. Black, Secretary-Treasurer; and the College Attorney, Robert Alexander.

Visitors: Annette Jenkins, Statesman; Bill Lazarus, Times-News;
Mr. & Mrs. Jim Newton and Terrill Castaneda.

MINUTES OF THE JULY 16 MEETING were approved as written upon MOTION by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Evans. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR JULY was approved upon MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Coleman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BILLS PAYABLE included vouchers #1 through #206 totaling \$86,749.97; fund transfers covered by vouchers #207 through #211 amounted to \$52,509.12.

July payrolls were: Regular \$157,772.44 Work Study \$ 18,031.88

A late claim for travel reimbursement for George Clawson was approved with the bills amounting to \$531.80. This would be voucher #212 and is not included in the total.

PERSONNEL: Personnel changes on the attached list were approved on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

FRONTIER FIELD: Mr. Jim Newton, a resident of Green Acres subdivision, which joins the Frontier Field property on the east, presented a petition, which he indicated had been signed by a majority of the residents of Green Acres. According to Mr. Newton the petition was to the City of Twin Falls requesting that the road leading from Frontier Field through Green Acres subdivision be closed. His contention was that the road was a public nuisance and hazardous to small children in the area. He requested that the Board of Trustees give their approval to this action. A MOTION to forestall action of the Board until further information could be obtained was made by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Coleman. Yes votes: Mr. Blastock, Mr. Hepworth. No vote: Mr. Evans. Motion carried.

ABSENCE: At this time, Mr. Blastock was called from the meeting for an emergency phone call.

TRUST LOANS & SCHOLARSHIPS: The Board approved ten scholarships in the aggregate amount of \$2230. A trust loan was recommended for Pierce Roan for \$300. Loans and scholarships were approved on MOTION by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Evans. Affirmative vote unanimous. Mr. Blastock absent.

BIDS: A bid of \$2524 for an air conditioner with Mechanical Equipment and Engineering, Boise Idaho, was approved on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Garrabrandt. Affirmative vote unanimous. Mr. Blastock absent.

- CERTIFICATION OF TAX LEVY: Upon MOTION by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Evans, a tax levy was certified to Jerome and Twin Falls Counties for the fiscal year July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974. The amounts were \$420,166 for Maintenance and Operation and \$214,303 for Bond and Interest Redemption. Affirmative vote unanimous. Mr. Blastock absent.
- RESOLUTION ON TRUST SIGNATURE: A resolution was adopted approving Dr.

 Taylor's signature and approval of loans and scholarships from the educational trust fund on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by John Coleman. Affirmative vote uanaimous. Mr. Blastock absent.
- TUITION WAIVER: A proposal to waive tuition for faculty and staff had been presented to the Board in its May meeting. The proposal had been tabled for consideration. A MOTION to deny the tuition waiver was made by Mr. Evans, no second, MOTION died.

MOTION was made by Mr. Garrabrandt to allow a 50% tuition waiver, no second, MOTION died.

Mr. Blastock returned to the Board meeting at this time. Mr. Evans again moved to deny the tuition waiver, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Yes votes, Mr. Coleman, Mr. Hepworth. No vote, Mr. Garrabrandt. MOTION carried.

FRONTIER FIELD: Upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Evans, Mr. Alexander, the College attorney, was instructed to contact representatives of the Frontier Riding Club and ask them to furnish evidence that they were meeting the terms of their lease of Frontier Field. This evidence is to be obtained by the September Board of Trustees meeting. Affirmative vote unanimous.

Subsequent to this motion discussion of the road through Green Acres subdivision was reopened.

Mr. Garrabrandt moved that the decision be tabled until an opinion could be obtained from the National Guard and the Frontier Riding Club. Motion seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

ABSENCE: Mr. Garrabrandt asked to be excused from the Board Meeting at this time.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT: Mr. Alexander reported that late on Friday afternoon August 17, 1973, he was called on the telephone and advised that the Human Rights Commission would meet on Saturday in Pocatello, Idaho, to consider a decision on the charges of discrimination based on sex brought against the College by Terrill Castaneda. Mr. Alexander reported that he was informed that this was not a hearing and he would not be allowed to respond to the Commission. He, therefore, declined the invitation to attend. He also indicated that the Times News had reported that the Idaho Human Rights Commission had found

probable discrimination by the College of Southern Idaho. It was also his understanding from the newspaper article that a conciliatory agreement would be asked for by the Idaho Human Rights Commission.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Q.

- 1. Dr. Taylor reported that as President of the College he had received no invitation or indication from the Idaho Human Rights Commission relative to any of their hearings on the Castaneda complaint of sex discrimination. He also reported that he and his staff had spent many hours preparing information requested by the Commission.
- 2. The College has been enrolling students for two weeks. Today, Monday, August 20, 1973, was the first day of faculty orientation. The faculty was again apprised of the self-study report due in January to the Accrediting Commission. A visit by the Commission will be made in April of 1974 for the purpose of reaffirming accreditation. A report will be made by the Commission in December of 1974.
- 3. The Green House has been remodeled for handicapped students. The parking lot has been paved.
- 4. The College is completing a new learning Center for deaf students in the vocational school on Kimberly Road.
- 5. The State Board of Education will meet on campus on October 6, 7, 1973. Dr. Taylor plans to arrange a luncheon meeting with them and the Board of Trustees.
- 6. The College is presently experimenting with a 10 watt translator attempting to pick up educational television broadcasts from KAID in Boise. A 100 watt translator is to be installed at a later date hopefully within 30 days.
- 7. The Federal Auditors should complete their report on the Audit of our Federal monies on College Work Study Program, EOG, and NDSL by September 15, 1973.
