MINUTES OF JANUARY 21, 1974, were approved as written upon MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for January, was approved upon MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BILLS PAYABLE included vouchers #1 through #260 totaling \$565,732.69; fund transfers covered by vouchers #261 through #268 amounted to \$171,473.10

January payrolls were: Regular \$147,026.00 Work Study \$ 13,898.06

A MOTION by Mr. Blastock seconded by Mr. Evans approved payment of the bills, and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the January payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PERSONNEL: Hiring of Rozanne Evans as a secretary, Sandra F. Hayes as a clerk-typist, Raymond Hatcher and Raymond Harmison as part time employees was approved on MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Evans. Affirmative vote unanimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOAMS in the amount of \$1,447.00 were approved on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock.

BID FOR EQUIPMENT for the Vocational TV center was approved to Intermountain

Video at \$15,320 and purchase of an up/down counter at \$400 and a one year service contract at \$660. The bid was approved subject to an award letter from State Vocational Education approving the expenditure.

MR. EVANS gave a committee report on Frontier Field. The committee consists of Eldon Evans, Bob Blastock, Dr. James Taylor, Thayne Lancaster, Tom Prescott, and Bob Harney. The resident manager at Frontier Field has been asked to move and to move all livestock as soon as possible, but no later than June 1, 1974.

#### COMMITTEE REPORT CONT'D.:

The committee recommended that primary use of the field be for the student agriculture programs at the college, but could see unlimited additional use by the public. The committee recommended that all corrals and barns be torn down saving the grandstands only.

The college attorney was asked to explore the idea of organizing Frontier Field as a separate legal entity.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor reported that he would leave Twin Falls for Boise immediately following the Board meeting. He has a meeting scheduled in Boise at 8:30 A.M. Tuesday February 19 and will meet with the Joint Appropriations Committee at 1:30 P.M. of the same day.

The College has received notice that \$70,000 would be released to start the working drawings on the new Vo Tech Building. Bids should be ready by mid July. The building would be used entirely for vocational programs.
