MINUTES OF JULY 21, 1975, were approved as written upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Evans. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for July, was approved upon MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #273, including 66A, 139A, 221A, 222A, totaling \$1078296.50; fund transfers covered by vouchers #274 through #282 amounted to \$54,639.44.

July payrolls were: Regular \$222,810.93 Work Study \$16,328.70

A MOTION by Mr. Evans seconded by Mr. Blastock approved the disbursements, and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the July payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PERSONNEL: Kenneth Ruby, Jolena Tuma, Lewis Stanerson, and Mary Ellen Kelly were employed on motion by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

MILL LEVY: for 1976 fiscal year of 6.277 mills for maintenance and operation and 1.793 mills for bonded indebtedness was approved on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOANS: Five scholarships totaling \$825.00 and one loan for \$200.00 were approved on MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Evans. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BID: for a diesel wheel tractor was let to Buhl Implement Company for \$13,000.00 on MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Construction is progressing on the new vocational technical building. The new 10,000 square foot addition was bid below estimate and allowed acceptance of three alternates: quarry tile, movable partitions and extension of the campus road.

The Exposition Center water problem is being resolved. The architect has brought in a hydrologist and an engineer. Figures were given to the contractor on Thursday, August 7 for his cost calculation for Change Order #2. Figures should be available Tuesday morning, August 19.

Dr. Taylor expressed appreciation on behalf of Mrs. Taylor and himself to board member, Eldon Evans, for a party commemorating 10 years of service to the College.

The faculty inservice workshop started today. We are almost fully staffed for the year. This week is registration week. Pre-registration indicated a good enrollment. Some vocational programs have filled. Classes start August 25.

Dr. Donnelly from Nevada was on campus last week as well as two college presidents from Wyoming. They were highly complimentary of the College- particularly the maintenance of buildings and grounds.

We have received no response from the State Board of Education regarding our decision not to implement NCHEMS.

Dr. Taylor encouraged the board to consider waiver of tuition and fees for spouses and members of faculty and staff. After discussion the proposal was tabled.
