CALL TO ORDER: 8:05 p.m. PRESIDING: LeRoy Craig

ATTENDING: Trustees: LeRoy Craig, Robert Blastock, Charles Lehrman John Coleman. Absent: Eldon Evans.

College Administration: Dr. James L. Taylor, President; Karl L. Black, Secretary-Treasurer, and Jerry Meyerhoeffer, Assistant to the President.

MINUTES OF DECEMBER 15, 1975, were approved as written upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Mr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for DECEMBER, was approved upon MOTION by Dr. Lehrman, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #267 including 190-A totaling \$216, 425.36; fund transfers covered by vouchers #268 through #275 amounted to \$31,158.30.

December payrolls were: Regular \$197, 502.53 Work Study \$12, 867.40

A MOTION by Dr. Lehrman seconded by Mr. Blastock approved the disbursements, and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the December payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

AUDIT REPORT: Mr. Tom Schabot of the C.P.A. firm of Tullis and Schabat gave the annual audit report. He commended College officials on the integrity of the accounting system and mentioned an audit exception on the inventory of equipment.

The audit was accepted and the firm was re-employed for the inext fiscal year on motion by Mr. Coleman, seconded by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Four scholarships were approved as well as a return of an unused scholarship to CENEX Corporation.

PERSONNEL: Louise Flowers resignation was regretfully accepted with commendation from the board for her service to the College.

Employment of three new people and the change in employment of one was approved on motion by Mr. Coleman, seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: A meeting was held on construction of the new vocational technical building. The state electrical inspector was at the meeting and some electrical problems were resolved. The building is ahead of schedule (hopefully a month).

Enrollment for Spring Semester should show a considerable increase; possibly as many as 200 academic students and 40 vocational.

Thursday, Friday and Saturday of last week Mountain States Association of Community Colleges met on campus. There are 20 colleges from 5 states in the association. A representative from Region VIII of the Department of Education located in Denver was present, also a Civil Rights Official. The discussion dealt with affirmative action and compliance with various federal regulations on discrimination and civil rights. We have asked Mr. Meyerhoeffer to conduct a study to determine if the College is in compliance in all respects.

The College is waiting for the attorney general's opinion on whether the state will continue to pay the employer's share of F.I.C.A. or the College will be required to. The amount in question is \$102,400 for the next fiscal year.

Dr. Taylor also mentioned some bills before the legislature that could effect the College such as the public employees negotiation bill and several tax reduction bills that could reduce general fund revenue.
