MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 21, 1977, were approved as written upon MOTION by Mr. Coleman, seconded by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative

vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR FEBRUARY, 1977, was accepted upon MOTION by Mr. Coleman, seconded by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative

vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #290 totaling \$427,185.06; fund transfers covered by vouchers #291

through #297 amounted to \$11,133.32.

February payrolls were: Regular \$228,339.41

Work/Study 13,589.57

A MOTION by Dr. Lehrman, seconded by Mr. Coleman approved the disbursements, and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the February payrolls. Affirmative

vote unanimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS: A \$100.00 scholarship for Larry Lux was approved on

MOTION by Dr. Lehrman, seconded by Mr. Coleman.

Affirmative vote unanimous.

EMPLOYMENT: Contracts were renewed for the 1977-78 fiscal year

for those employees on the attached list on MOTION by Dr. Lehrman, seconded by Mr. Coleman. Affirmative

vote unanimous.

LEHRMAN: Dr. Lehrman reported that an Idaho artist is looking

for a place to donate his paintings. We might consider contacting him with the possibility of giving them to

our museum. His name is Robert Pendlebury from

Blackfoot, Idaho.

EQUIPMENT: Bids on equipment for the Exposition Center were

reviewed. The bids from Double D. Manufacturing and Scranton Corral Systems were rejected as not meeting specifications. The low acceptable bid was awarded to David Ball of Rigby, Idaho at \$16,776.75

The low bid of \$37,807.00 from Aatronics of Boise, Idaho for a sound system for the Exposition Center was accepted. Both bids were let on MOTION by Mr. Coleman, seconded by Dr. Lehrman. MOTION carried. Mr. Blastock abstained from voting and asked for a detailed study of "what we get for what it costs".

HOBBY CAR:

A report was made to the Board that a Model T Ford car which was remodeled by the C.S.I. Vocational Technical Division had been advertised for sale on closed bid. Four appraisals had been obtained prior to the bidding at an average of \$2,275.00. Only one bid was received for \$500.00. Idaho Code does not permit accepting a bid lower than the appraisal.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor would like direction from the

Board to proceed with plans for a 2,400 square foot

metal building for storage by the Buildings and Grounds

Department.

The current proposal of Idaho Power before the P.U.C. would increase power rates by 22.8%. The cost to C.S.I. would be an increase of \$43,683.00 a year making the total power bill in excess of \$200,000.00. We are exploring alternate telephone and energy sources.

We have requested that the Fish Hatchery Lease be extended from 5 year to 20 years, and the Twin Falls Fish and Wildlife Conservation Corporation agrees that if their organization ceases to exist, the property would revert to the College of Southern Idaho.
Mr. Coleman moved that the Board instruct the Chairman to sign the new lease. The MOTION was seconded by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

It is expected that the legislature will pass the bill to allow a \$25.00 increase in tuition for the coming year.

ADJOURNMENT: was moved by Mr. Blastock, seconded by Dr. Lehrman at 9:30 p.m. Affirmative vote unanimous.
