MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 16, 1981, were approved as written upon MOTION by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for November was accepted upon MOTION by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBRUSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #293 and #501 through #613 totaling \$248,993.24; including #82A, #564A; fund transfers covered by youchers #294 through #299 amounted to \$5,830.38.

November payrolls were:

Regular Work Study \$448,348.06 16,819.78

A MOTION by Dr. Lehrman approved the disbursements and the transfer of funds and acknowledged the November payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DR. THAD SCHOLES was sworn in as a new member of the Board of Trustees to replace Lloyd Hamilton who resigned in September.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOANS: Five scholarships totaling \$1,137.50 and one loan totaling \$280 were approved upon MOTION by Dr. Lehrman.

MRS. BONDURANT: The Chairman of the Board presented Mrs. Bondurant with a letter from Dr. Taylor in response to her request in the last board meeting.

APPRAISAL ON SURPLUS EQUIPMENT: An Appraisal from Marshall Lewis and Associates on the IBM Series One equipment was presented to the Board. Karl Black indicated to the Board that it is very difficult to get appraisals on used computer equipment. About the only avenue is to contact a computer broker. The appraisal we have is from such a firm. Dr. Lehrman made a MOTION that the property be declared surplus and advertised for bid. This was to be done only if an opinion from the college attorney indicated that we had complied with the law of disposal of property. The MOTION passed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor indicated that a group of nursing students from the College of Southern Idaho took the state exam recently and all passed. He also indicated that the average scores in the state of Idaho were above most other states.

Dr. Taylor indicated to the Board that Christmas vacation would start on the 20th of December and all offices would be closed. He indicated that there would be a savings on energy and it would also allow the maintenance department to reclean and refurbish the administration building. Offices would open on January 4.

Dr. Taylor outlined some of the problems confronting the legislature for this year. He indicated that there was much confusion concerning the proposed federal block grants which amount to 50 or 60 million dollars in the state of Idaho for education. He indicated that there would be a proposal before the legislature this year to do away with property tax. If this were done, it would leave no source for funds for local education other than through a sales tax increase. If all funding comes from the state, it would undoubtedly do away with local boards and local autonomy. He said the 1% initiative continues to erode local taxing districts and local autonomy. The Chairman of the Board expressed his support for local autonomy in our schools.

ADJOURNMENT was declared at 6:03 p.m.

#### Dear Sirs:

As requested by the Board of Trustees at the October 19, regular meeting, we are putting in writing our verbal request for detailed information again concerning the complete C.S.I. employee salary plan. We will appreciate the following: (1) starting wage and/or starting salary for all of the job categories within all departments (all permanent employee job categories in vocational, academic administration, any other programs and so on); (2)detailed rank and step increase procedures and implementation(such as the 5 person selection process to evaluate in all categories of C.S.I. employment, the process used by the various five person groups and where fewer persons or other processes are used and so on) and copies of the specific dollar amount rank increase scales; (3) detailed merit step increase scales, procedures, and implementation for all employee job categories, copies of forms used and so on; (4) explain in detail salary adjustment or equity; (5) details concerning development of and administration of all C.S. I. job descriptions; (6) include the C.S.I. "administration department" in the detailed information concerning the entire C.S.I. employee salary plan; (7) all of the details concerning the salary plan, procedures and implementation for the C.S.I. president position; (8) who has the authority for cost of living increases and whether the same percent of the cost of living mrease is given to all permanent employees.

As you are aware, we made our first request for the total C.S.I. permanet employee salary plan at the regular August C.S.I. Board of Trustees meeting. Requests were made again in September and again at the October regular meeting. We finally did receive a very very brief written overview of only part of the C.S.I. employee salary plan just prior to the October meeting. We, as do all taxpayers, need to know what the College we are supporting is doing. Please respond fully this time to our request.

Perhaps you have the C.S.I. total salary plan, procedures and implementation in booklet form. If so, we will appreciate a copy.
