MINUTES OF AUGUST 15, 1983, were approved as written on MOTION by Mr. Blastock.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR AUGUST was accepted upon MOTION by Dr. Scholes. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS: included vouchers #1 through #325 and #501 through #582 and #701 through #708 totaling \$2,365,794.29.

Voucher #232 to Mark Neiwirth was excluded until additional information is disseminated to the Board. (The Board was canvassed by September 30, 1983, and was in agreement to go ahead with this disbursement.)

A MOTION by Mr. Blastock approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the August payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Fifteen scholarships totaling \$2,550 for the fall semester and two scholarships totaling \$600 for spring semester were approved on MOTION by Mr. Blastock.

PLANT FACILITY: A quotation for \$8,958.42 for equipment and cabinets in the chemistry lab to be disbursed from the Plant Facilities Reserve Fund was approved on MOTION by Mr. Blastock.

REPRESENTATIVE TOM STIVERS: Representative Stivers spoke to the Board and indicated support for the IACI study that has taken place the last year. He was complimentary of Jerry Meyerhoeffer's activity with that Board. He expressed belief that as the economy turns around more adequate funding will be available for education at all levels. He does believe that the Sunset clause on the sales tax will not be changed. He also indicated to the Board that he did not believe the state ratio of funding for junior colleges should change because he did not feel that we wanted more state control. He had requested materials from President Meyerhoeffer for legislative briefings that he will conduct in October.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Meyerhoeffer expressed thanks to Representative Stivers for his friendship to the institution and for attending the Board meeting.

He passed a handout to the Board on the ACCT meeting in Phoenix in October.

The Shields Building is being re-roofed. We have run into some difficulty with expansion due to the heat while the roof was off of the building.

The Moscow, Idaho, Chamber of Commerce will be on campus for lunch on Wednesday and will visit some of the area fish hatcheries.

President Meyerhoeffer reported that he had met with the Mayor and the City Business Manager concerning location of the swimming pool and felt very good about the meeting. The City Council would like to meet with our Board and walk over the prospective site for the city swimming pool.

The State Board of Education will be meeting in Gooding later this month. The College in cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce would like to host a social at the Blue Lakes Country Club from 6 pm to 8 pm on Wednesday evening September 28. Invitation was extended to members of the Board to attend this event.

President Meyerhoeffer reported to the Board that CSI has the largest increase in enrollment since its inception.

HAMMER-DRILL

The Hilti hammer-drill was purchased for \$665.54. The balance of \$227.56 was for 6 drills, a chisel bit and an \$81.00 adaptor (which allows us to use a much wider range of drill sizes).

Other quotations were obtained at the time of purchase as follows:

The Hilti, which we purchased - \$665.54 (This is considered the top of the line in quality. We were able to get a factory discount of \$99.00)

Black & Decker - 660.00 (This is considered the bottom of the line in quality. We have worn out two of these).

Milwaukee Tool - 754.00

MARK NEIWIRTH

is probably the most talented and gifted pianist to come out of the Magic Valley. He is a graduate of Kimberly High School, studied with Teals Bellini while in high school and has been studying and performing successfully in New York the last few years. He is 25 years old. The last two years he has given several performances locally to full houses.

I proposed that Mark and I give a joint recital on Sunday, October 16.

Neither of our CSI piano teachers canplay some of my accompaniments.

We would also present lectures-recitals to music appreciation and music history classes the week of the program. No admission charge would be made so as many students would come as possible.

Preparation by Mark would involve some 50 or 60 hours of practice and rehearsal learning new material. He had planned to return to New York October 1 but will stay long enough to make this his last local appearance for this year.

His fee is \$500.00. To put this in prespective: pianist Steven De Groot received \$5000.00 from the Magic Valley Symphony for his solo with them last October. Pianist Madaleine Hsu of Boise State receives \$1000.00 for a recital. The Twin Falls Musi Club gave him \$500.00 for a recital here last year.

I hope this can be worked out.
