TREASURER'S REPORT FOR DECEMBER 1984 was accepted on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

<u>DISBURSEMENTS</u> included vouchers #1 through #304 and #501 through #595 and #701 through #706 totaling \$331,159.63.

MOTION by Dr. Scholas approved the dishursements and t

A MOTION by Dr. Scholes approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the December payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

GEOTHERMAL WATER: The college attorney was not present at the meeting, but had sent a letter to the board recommending that they retain John Rosholt to determine what the college's water right is on the geothermal wells. A MOTION was made by Mr. Blastock to accept the recommendation and for the college to give any data they might have that would be helpful to Mr. Rosholt.

TRUSTEE ELECTION: Results of the December trustee election were presented to the board showing Dr. Thad Scholes with 1199 votes and the contender, Jay Smith, with 354 votes. A MOTION to accept the election results as presented was made by Mr. Babcock.

REORGANIZATION: LeRoy Craig was nominated as chairman by Mr. Blastock. Dr. Charles
Lehrman was nominated as vice chairman by Mr. Babcock. William E.
Babcock was nominated as clerk by Dr. Scholes. Karl Black was nominated as secretary-treasurer by Mr. Blastock. Voting for above positions was unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Meyerhoeffer reported that two letters had been received: one commending Jan Mittleider for the Over 60 fitness program; the other letter from the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center commending the college for cooperation with them in a recent program.

Fran Tanner just returned from a recent forensics meet with two students placing in first place. The enrollment for the spring semester is about even with the fall semester.

President Meyerhoeffer reported on a meeting with the State Board of Education where the community colleges were asked to respond to the status of governance between the local board and the State Board of Education concerning the community colleges. One of the outgrowths of the meeting was a discussion and a requested report on transferability of credits.

Some time was spent last week in Boise at the legislature. The Joint Finance Appropriation Committee hearing for CSI will be next Friday. On Thursday morning we plan to have breakfast with the area legislators.

President Meyerhoeffer also presented the grade policy recommendations from the faculty committee that had been appointed and indicated that it had been approved by over 95 percent of the faculty.

Dear President Meyerhoeffer:

As you know, we have been working on the problem with the geothermal wells on campus for the past several months. The problem is now becoming acute in that we are experiencing a steady drop in pressure of some 1/2 pound per month.

I recently retained Mr. John Rosholt of the firm of Nelson, Rosholt, Robertson, Tolman & Tucker. Mr. Rosholt is the water lawyer in Idaho in my opinion. We also retained the services of Anderson & Kelly in Boise. That firm specializes in water and geology as that science is included in water problems.

The future holds for the District the possibility of heating and cooling all of our buildings with water from the wells. That project includes the rather expensive process of retro-fitting the buildings to accommodate that type of energy.

It is my opinion that the Board of Trustees has a duty to establish and protect this valuable asset which belongs to the taxpayers of Twin Falls and Jerome Counties. It is further my opinion that the Board must determine the extent of our right in the geothermal resource before we go any further with implementing its use.

It is my recommendation that the Board of Trustees retain Mr. John Rosholt to pursue that objective. Mr. Rosholt has my highest recommendation and will be of immeasureable assistance to the Board.
