MINUTES OF OCTOBER 20, 1986, were approved as written on MOTION by
Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR OCTOBER was accepted upon MOTION by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #296 and #501 through #596 and #701 through #708 totaling \$346,835.77.

A MOTION by Dr. Scholes approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the October payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BIDS: Bids were presented to the board for furnishing the college catalog for the next two years. Bids were close enough in dollars that the board asked that they be reviewed again before the board passed on them.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

- 1. Drug testing in employment and in athletics has been challenged by the ACLU. Many colleges are also setting a policy on AIDS.
- 2. Several accolades have been received by the college. The CSI theatre group has received a national honorary theatre award. The Herrett Museum is only the second museum in the state to receive accreditation. The CSI Music Fest presented each summer received honorable mention from the National Federation of Music Clubs. Margaret Vincent, Jerry Beck and Ruby Petersen have done a lot of work on the music fest. Jim Walker has also received national recognition.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT CONTINUED:

- 3. Last Friday the Legislative Interim Committee met in Boise. They agreed to seek a 50 percent state funding level for the community colleges over the next three years. They put the property tax proposal on hold. They agreed that the community colleges would participate with the Program Committee of the State Board. They agreed to look at changes in the Idaho Code referring to junior colleges.
- 4. The area legislators have been invited to the College of Southern Idaho the evening of December 9.
- 5. It was a great honor for the College of Southern Idaho to host the President of the United States on campus. We felt at the time that it was logistically impossible to hold school, and, therefore, dismissed school for the day. The costs to the college were minimal. Many of the changes we made in the Expo Center had to be made for the Mid-Management Christmas event that would take place the following week.
- 6. The administration will attend a retreat on planning and hope to come up with four or five specific goals to send to the Board of Trustees.
