REVENUE REPORT for May was accepted upon MOTION by Dr. Scholes. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BIDS: A bid for construction materials for the fish hatchery was awarded to Volco, Inc. The only bidder on the project for \$18,915.28 on MOTION by Dr. Scholes. Affirmative vote unanimous.

Automatic Door Openers: A bid was awarded to Automatic Doors of Boise, Idaho, for \$13,245 to furnish 12 automatic door openers for handicapped access to the various buildings on campus. The MOTION was by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

- 1. The state building inspector was on campus a year ago and cited us for some safety problems. He returned last week and was very pleased with the compliance that had taken place.
- 2. We are just entering a new contract year for employees. Employees generally received approximately a 3 percent increase.

SUMMER SCHOOL: Jerry Beck gave a report on summer school. He indicated that the enrollment was up approximately 16.5 percent and predicted a 20 percent increase by the end of summer.

BUDGET: The fiscal year 1989 budget was presented to the Board of Trustees. After careful review of the budget, it was accepted upon MOTION by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

Public hearing will be held at 5:30 p.m. June 20 on the proposed budget for fiscal year 1989 for the College of Southern Idaho. The session will be held in the president's board room in the Taylor Administration Building.

The proposed budget is \$9,650,880, compared to \$9,225,044 for the current operating year. While this represents an overall increase of 5 per cent, Karl Black, Dean of Finance, said 1 per cent of this figure is to replace Title III funded positions. While the college has applied for refunding from the federal government, it will not receive word on this until October, so the amount was included in the total budget.

County tuition has been increased from \$425 to \$465 per semester. However, Black noted the college assessed the maximum on property tax levies last year and market value is expected to be down about 4 to 5 per cent on this next assessment.

College employees received a 3 per cent pay increase for the next fiscal year.

COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO GENERAL FUND BUDGET NARRATIVE JULY 1, 1988 TO JUNE 30, 1989

REVENUE

TUITION & FEES:

Tuition and fees have increased 10% above last years budget. We are projecting a 4% increase for next years budget.

COUNTY TUITION:

County tuition has been increased from \$425 to \$465 per semester. This accounts for \$40,000 of the increase in county tuition. The balance is due to an increase last year in enrollment from the counties outside of the district.

COUNTY PROPERTY TAXES:

Last year we were at the maximum on our property tax levy. The best estimate we can obtain for next year is that market value will be down between 4% and 5%. The levy is budget driven. In other words the amount we approve in the budget is the amount we assess the counties. If the amount is too high, it will be up to them to reduce it to the appropriate figure. Since no-one seems to be able to give us a reliable figure at this point it would seem logical to leave the figure where it is.

OTHER REVENUE:

Other revenue includes rental on Fine Arts, Expo, and Gym as well as any balance in the contingency fees, etc.

ADMINISTRATION

PERSONNEL:

We hired a full-time employee in the Business Office to help with accounts payable.

FRINGE:

Fringe benefits are affected a great deal by the make up of the department, i.e. part-time, full-time salary range, etc. Health insurance premiums went up \$230 per person per year. This item alone cost the college \$77,000. This is why in all departments the fringe benefits went up disproportionately to salaries.

LIBRARY

CAPITAL OUTLAY:

The library has requested additional money for books to meet the growing informational needs of the college and to keep scientific and technical works from becoming obsolete.

STUDENT SERVICES

REVENUE:

Revenues are generated from fees for graduation, transcripts, add/drop, and also administration expense reimbursement on financial aid. This year we have decided to show total revenue and expense rather than offset the revenue generated against the expense.

SALARIES:

A secretary was hired for the Financial Aid Office. Debbie Klimes was moved to Student Services as a counselor.

MUSEUM

SALARIES:

Phyllis Morgret's salary was budgeted for part time last year. She has gone back to full time for next year.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

BUDGET:

This is the first year since the continuing education program has been reorganized to have sufficient history to record revenue and expenditures by category. The increase in budget reflects about \$24,000 to replace salaries that have been funded by Title III. It also reflects \$50,000 to pay for off-campus credit instruction not previously paid by continuing ed. The balance of the increase is for fringe benefits.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

The increase in budget is to pay employees previously paid by Title III.

SUSPENSE & FIXED CHARGES

TRANSFERS NON-MANDATORY:

Transfers non-mandatory (planning) is set aside for special projects prioritized through the planning process. They include student advising, faculty development, and purchase of equipment.

ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION

PERSONNEL:

This budget has been reduced by \$65,000. One employee has been transferred to the vocational budget in the amount of \$15,000. The \$50,000 balance has been included in the continuing ed budget. This is a transfer of the off campus credit courses.

CAPITAL OUTLAY:

This budget has been reduced by \$30,000 one time money budgeted last year.
