MINUTES OF APRIL 19, 1993, were approved as written on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

TREASURERS REPORT: Acceptance of the Treasurer's report was approved on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

#### BIDS:

- The low bid of \$143,952.08 for channel 9 transmitting equipment by Acrodyne, Incorporated was discussed. The bid was accepted pending a letter from the president of Acrodyne assuring the College that the equipment would meet specifications. Conditional acceptance of the bid was on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- The scheduled computer bid opening was cancelled due to a bid protest. The computers will be rebid with tighter specifications.

<u>PRESIDENT'S REPORT:</u> President Jerry Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

- 1. Diane Elassick and Kimberly Schoenaur presented President Meyerhoeffer with a hat and a ribbon and thanked him for his support of Phi Theta Kappa over the last year.
- 2. Dr. Rick Parker and Dr. Chuck Brockway, University of Idaho Hydrologist, presented a plan for constructing a sediment pond for the Perine Coulee on the Ag Endowment property. The project would be a joint effort between the Soil Conservation District, the Twin Falls Canal Company and the College.

The Board expressed strong support for the concept but was concerned about the College's liability for hazardous waste that may accumulate in the sediment and the liability associated with an open pond. The Board agreed to review an operational agreement with the Twin Falls Canal Company which would address the hazardous waste and liability concerns.

3. Jim Woods, Herrett Museum Director, gave a presentation on his trip to Guatemala. He also advised the Board that a formal museum agreement was being formed between the Herrett Museum and the Guatemalan National Museum. The agreement would involve shared collections and resources.

The Board praised Mr. Woods for the recognition he had brought to the College through his outstanding work.

- 4. Ron Shopbell explained the summer and fall telecommunications schedule. He also noted that grant funding was being applied for to add another sixteen sites to the system.
- 5. Dr. Joan Edwards presented a list of the CSI Foundation Minigrants that were awarded to faculty and staff. Out of twenty seven applications, fifteen grants were awarded. It was noted that many grantees matched Foundation funds with their own money and that the awards were extremely beneficial for staff development.
- 6. The President reported on meeting with Idaho State University, Boise State University, Eastern Idaho Vocational/Technical School and College of Southern Idaho administrators on ethnic diversity. The meeting was the first of five meetings that will result in a campus Ethnic Diversity Plan.
