MINUTES OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF JULY 15, 2002, were approved as written on MOTION by Donna Brizee. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report was approved on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

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BIDS:

1. The Board approved the low bid of International Microwave Corporation of East Norwalk, Connecticut in the amount of \$27,750 for the specified digital microwave radios on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

Funding for this equipment is from the Albertson's ARTEC grant.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. The President discussed the construction of a new student union building with the Board. He noted that we had the smallest amount of space dedicated to students of any college or university in the state. The President stated that we must be a college of choice from both a college experience and academic quality point of view. We are in a competitive market for students.

Although the funding is in place, the project has been on hold due to the fiscal problems of the state.

Glenn Arrington of Starr Corporation, the design/build contractor for the new student union building, advised the Board that a bid no later than early October would be very competitive. Waiting past this date could add up to one percent in total project costs. He also advised the Board that the plans were ready to bid and that his firm was ready to start on the project immediately.

Dr. Thad Scholes moved that the Board direct the administration to survey public officials concerning their perceptions on starting construction on the new student union and advise the Board of these perceptions by Monday, August 26, 2002 on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

- 2. The Board approved the fiscal year 2003 budget on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 3. The President advised the Board that Frontier Road had been reopened. He told them that the road had six speed bumps and a round about to slow down traffic. The speed limit on the road is twenty miles per hour. Our security staff will be monitoring the road for speeders. If we continue to have speed problems on the road, the
