MINUTES OF THE REGULAR AND EXECUTIVER SESSIONS OF FEBRUARY 24, 2003, were approved as written on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's report was approved on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

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PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. The Board approved the summer 2003 dorm rate charges on MOTION by Dr. Charles Lehrman. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 2. The Board approved the fiscal year 2004 fall/spring dorm rate charges on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 3. Mike Mason advised the Board on the status of current building projects. He stated that the new student union building was on schedule, the one stop shop area was scheduled for completion in mid-June and that the Herrett Addition plans were to be completed and ready for bid next week.
- 4. Randy Dill reported on planned summer maintenance projects. The following projects are scheduled:
 - a. Completion of radiation technology lab
 - b. Addition of nine acres to the surface water irrigation system
 - Replacement of the main air handler in the Canyon Building
 - d. Library geothermal system upgrade
 - e. Art Annex heating system upgrade
 - f. Shields Building conversion to geothermal heating
 - q. Library special collections remodel
 - h. Construction of maintenance paint and grounds shop
- 5. Dr. Ken Campbell reviewed the history and current status of the existing telecommunications system. He advised the Board that a \$300,000 federal grant to upgrade the system would be spent as follows:
 - a. Replacement of cameras purchased in 1990
 - b. Upgrade of camera control system
 - c. Expansion of bandwidth to Jerome Butte
 - d. Addition of new sites

The President thanked Dr. Campbell and Char Sutton for their work on the grant. He also noted that the grant would not have been possible without the assistance of our congressional delegation. CSI Trustees
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6. Dr. Jerry Beck reported on the Idaho State Board of Education proposal to change of higher education service areas. He said the proposal did not address dual credit, elearning or contract training.

Dr. Beck stated that the Idaho State Board of Education would be doing more research on the issue over the next several months before making a final decision.

- 7. Dr. Jerry Beck advised the Board that fourteen of the seventeen students affected by the Micron layoffs in Boise had been contacted and arrangements concerning their education were completed. Attempts are continuing to locate the remaining three students.
- 8. Kathy Pullman and Sarah Harris presented a slide show and narrative of the student field trip to Costa Rica last summer. The trip meets the four year college graduation requirement for a field experience.
- 9. The President reported on his trip to Boise to visit legislators. He advised the Board that it would be at least three weeks before the legislature adjourned. This extended session will cause us to delay issuance of employment contracts.
