<u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u>: The agenda was approved on MOTION by Trustee Mittleider. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

<u>STUDENT/FACULTY/STAFF ACHIEVEMENTS:</u> President Fisher recognized Administrative Assistant Leah Scrimpsher as a recipient of a nationally competitive scholarship award from the American Association of Women in Community Colleges (AAWCC). Also recognized was Dean of Career and Technical Education Dr. Barry Pate and Grant Writer Emily English for the success of CSI's NextGen Program grant submission.

BOARD MINUTES: The following June 20, 2023 – Regular Meeting Board of Trustee meeting minutes were amended as follows:

Page 2 under "unfinished Business" – add the following to complete the sentence: "The architects have completed preliminary designs for the LeRoy Craig Jerome Center, and CSI will review the designs and gather feedback soon, including briefings with the CSI Board of Trustees to determine their support." The amended minutes were accepted on MOTION by Trustee Mittleider. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's report was accepted on MOTION by Trustee Kern. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

NEW BUSINESS:

Action Items

1. The Board approved the Head Start/Early Head Start monthly fiscal and operational reports, Self-Assessment report and the financial reports on MOTION by Chairman Stone. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

- Vice President of Finance and Administration Jeff Harmon presented the FY 2024 budget.
 The Board approved the FY 2024 budget hearing as presented on MOTION by Trustee
 Mittleider. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 3. Director of Human Resources Eric Nielson presented a recommendation to the Trustees that the policy in section VIII. Hiring Policies B. internal hiring preferences to be replaced with the following: Qualified College employees are welcome to apply to fill vacancies in the workforce. No preference will be given over outside applicants. The board approved the change on MOTION by Trustee McClure. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

Information Items

- Assistant Dean for Student Access and Outreach Bobbi Sumpter presented reports on the work accomplished by the Admissions team to grow enrollment and to accomplish outreach to non-traditional populations. She also highlighted the work of the Bridge to Success team in supporting non-traditional students. She reported that by Fall 2023, CSI will have about 500 students in the Bridge to Success Program.
- 2. Herrett Center Director Joey Heck gave a report on the Herrett Center activities. He reported that the Herrett Center is up in attendance at the Observatory and planetarium shows as well as holding more events in the Rick Allen Room than in 2022. Also included in his report was a preview of the 2023-2024 Arts on Tour schedule.
- 3. Dean of Institutional Effectiveness and Communication Chris Bragg presented the 2022-2023 (except Summer 2023) annual enrollment report. He reported CSI was up five percent in headcount compared to the 2021-2022 year.
- 4. Chief Information Officer Ryan Jund presented an Information Security Update to the Trustees. He reported that there will be enhanced focus on information security and cybersecurity this year, with greater focus on the human factors that can help prevent cyber-attacks.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Fisher gave his monthly report.
